aving known the Garman name as well as their stellar reputation for quality work in new home construction, I was drawn to their renovation business, Renovations by Garman. urchasing a home almost always necessitates a move. In deciding to purchase this home, the prospective homeowner knew he would have to make two—his and the house itself.

Slated for demolition to make room for an expansion of a new housing development, this historic farmhouse was purchased just in the nick of time. Instead of the wrecking ball, the new homeowner, Whit, made the decision to have the home lifted from its foundation and carefully transported 800 feet to a new location where it would be more than welcome.

According to research published by the *Lititz Record Express*, the two-story farmhouse was built in 1812 by Michael Groszman—a first generation Warwick Township settler and Revolutionary War veteran. Groszman built the house for his daughter Mary and her husband John Leib.







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Although very well constructed, the floor plan of the home and typical for its day, consisted of specific-purpose rooms which were partitioned off from one another. Even the front entry way, for example, opened into a small foyer from which entry to each of the front rooms was through separate doors. Upstairs, two of the four bedrooms were accessible only by going through another bedroom—there was no separate entrance from the hallway. So much for privacy in the early 1800's.

Despite having to move the home AND the need for a complete interior makeover (including a garage/mudroom addition), Whit recognized both the challenge as well as the unique opportunity before him. After all, how often does one get a chance to preserve a historical landmark while converting it into a highly functional and energy-efficient 21st century beauty complete with all the modern comforts?

In choosing a builder to oversee the project, Whit was drawn to Garman Builders who, over the years, had earned a stellar reputation for new home construction. As-

to the age and structural deficiencies in the framing, the home needed to be completely demoed and reframed leaving only the brick shell remaining. We had to build a house inside a house. This allowed us to level the floors, open the floor plan, create

wall cavities to allow for outlet placement and insulation.

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move to its new location, the interior of the home was completely gutted before being rebuilt.



Looking at these series of photos, you can get an appreciation of this project's scope and complexity. In addition to the 800-foot






the entire interior was removed (fireplaces excluded), the Garman team of trade partners were able to extract and restore many of

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the home's original features such as the hand-carved fireplace surrounds, window jam paneling, as well as detailed carving on the facia and flooring.



And in addition to developing a highly functional and open floor plan as requested by Whit, Garman was also charged with bringing the home up-to-date with all the latest energy-efficient advances. Included among them was a new roof, replacement of all windows and doors, insulation, new mechanicals (separate heating and air-conditioning systems for each floor), new electrical service and plumbing.

As with most new construction, it's probably safe to say that the kitchen is this project's centerpiece. Taking nothing away from the project's other aspects or fine features, this kitchen is awesome!

Another awesome feature on the first floor is, of course, the new open floor plan. From the front door, you are head on to the beautiful new staircase with the living room area and dining area to the left and right, respectively. Off to the right back corner, there's even a line of vision into that spectacular kitchen.

In addition to a 2-car garage, the new addition includes a mudroom entry that also has a door to the flagstone patio on the street side of the home. Conveniently located off the mudroom before reaching the garage is a powder room and a well appointed laundry.

The second floor layout is dramatically different from the 1812 version described earlier. Instead of four, there are now three bedrooms—all of which are accessible from the hallway. The master bedroom now has an adjoining bath as well as a spacious walk-in closet.

From Fred Heim's point of view, Renovation by Garman's goal in this project as requested by Whit, was to keep that farmhouse charm but to open it up for how people want to live today. As evidenced by Whit's comments sprinkled throughout these pages, it's safe to say that goal was very much accomplished.






he Garman team was able to retain, save and use many of the great original features in the home such as the hand-carved fireplaces, window jam paneling,


