- The soft, yet sophisticated combination of mid-tones can create a very "romantic" room. Mid-tones would include sage green, beige, lavender, teal, apricot, rose basil, etc.
- The rich, warm, luxurious colors (robust red, rich browns, desert camel, burnished gold, orange mango, curry paprika, and of course black) sometimes accentuated by leopard upholstery, will create a very "sensuous" space.
