Orange is THE Color for 2012

Whether you are using orange as an accent color, or incorporating it by adding vibrant wallpaper, balance all that color on the wall with soft blues and yellows. Use textured or solid fabrics for your largest items, such as the sofa, bedspread, or window treatments.

Blue, the Jewel of the Sea

Blues gained popularity in 2011 and continues to be red hot in 2012. From sparkling sea-glass blue to colonial blue-grey, blues are suitable for all living spaces, being a naturally soothing color that is loved—in one iteration or another—by almost everyone.

A blue wall tends to make a room feel larger. This is important to know if you have a small room that you want to expand rather than make it more intimate and close.

You can mix and match warm and cool colors with purpose and meaning to advance your design goals and make a room more interesting. The blue walls in this bedroom (below)



are expanding away from the viewer and the yellow accents are advancing toward the viewer.

We are also seeing more deeper shades of blues hitting the textile markets. Navy blue is coming back paired with rich browns. Again, mix florals with geometrical patterns such as hounds tooth, large stripes, brocades and chevron patterns.

Green, from Farm to Forest

Greens, ranging from celery and asparagus to fir and fern, allow homeowners to bring the comforting feelings of the world outside into the world within.

The vibrant color green and lavender reads fresh in any combination of colors. Just a hint will add life to a space. Try using a vibrant floral wallpaper and mix in a few solid, textured or geometrical fabrics to make the room a pretty and serene space.

Black and White

The classic combination of black and white isn't just for Cape Cods. You'll see much more of it in all sorts of settings, from contemporary apartments to historic homes. Wallpaper is a great way to add pattern and freshen the interior with something smart and stylish.



Say NO to White Ceilings

Paint the ceiling a shade lighter than the wall color to visually raise it and avoid a jarring stop-start effect. Or go a shade darker to bring it down and add coziness.

Bring the Outdoors In

For those who are opting for a tranquil and spacious sunroom, consider utilizing calming blues and greens as part of your sunroom color scheme. Popular garden motifs and the concept of "bringing the outdoors inside" highlight a soothing color

scheme that is comprised of a soothing blue and green color palette.

Paint Tips

High quality Matte or Eggshell finishes provide superior washability, but with a softer sheen.

Benjamin Moore Kitchen & Bath or Aura Bath & Spa, provide a mildew resistant coating and is a good choice, since high moisture contributes to mildew growth in those areas.

Two schools of thought for testing a paint color before taking the plunge:

- 1) Paint the wall that gets the most natural light. If you like it in the amplified light, it should work on the walls.
- 2) Paint a piece of foam core, then move it around the room to see how it looks in different light and against trim.

We recommend purchasing the pint sized paint samples to try it on the wall. Use two coats of paint for good coverage and paint the sample in a corner of the room, because paint may look different on each wall.

Now Tie it Altogether!

- When choosing colors for a bedroom, pick out the bedding first and go from there.
- Follow the Rule of Three: When you pick a color, use it at least
